1 STEP 1 OF OVERALL GOAL DETERMINATION

Step 1 of the overall goal determination is computed by determining the number of ready, willing, and able DBEs performing the types of work noted above as listed in the current DBE Directory prepared and maintained by the Montana Department of Transportation against the number of ready, willing, and able businesses available in the same NAICS code. The total number of businesses was obtained from the Census Bureau's Business Pattern database, at http://www.census.gov/econ/cbp/index.html. The latest information currently available from this site is from 2013.

The geographical area used to determine the number of ready, willing, and able DBEs and total businesses included *Lewis and Clark County and Jefferson County, Montana*. This represents the area from which a substantial majority of the contractors and subcontractors come and the area in which the Airport Commission spends a majority of its contracting dollars.

Finally, by applying the ratio of ready, willing, and able DBE firms and the total number of ready, willing, and able firms from the census data to the estimated percentage of total project costs, the Step 1 goal is determined.

The Step 1 goal was determined for each project anticipated for the *Helena Regional Airport*. A summary of the Step 1 goal determinations are summarized for each project below

Step 2. Analysis: Adjustment to Step 1 base figure to make it more precise

The *Helena Regional Airport Authority* has previously undertaken projects at the *Helena Regional Airport* requiring an overall goal under 49 CFR Part 26.

FY 2013

The project for FY 2013 at the Helena Regional Airport consisted of an Airfield Lighting Rehabilitation Project. DBE participation was encouraged with the bids. Pavlik Electric Co., Inc was awarded the contract at a bid price of \$1,777,251.89. Total DBE participation was 0% since Pavlik Electric is not a DBE Contractor.

FY 2014

The AIP project for FY 2013 at the Helena Regional Airport was utilized for the completion of one construction project and the acquisition of snow removal equipment (including one four wheel drive bi-lateral tractor and one all wheel steer chassis with snow blower and broom). The construction project consisted of: expansion of the existing short term parking lot; rehabilitation of the existing short term lot though crack sealing and fog sealing; rehabilitation of: the compass rose, Station 1 service roads, and three service roads near the general aviation ramp through milling and/ or total replacement of the existing asphalt; and crack sealing of Taxiways 'A' and 'C' consisted of a the acquisition of snow removal equipment (including one four wheel drive bilateral tractor and one all wheel steer chassis with snow blower and broom). DBE participation was encouraged with the bids.

Helena Sand & Gravel was awarded the contract at a bid price of \$282,577.18. Total DBE participation was \$35,252.00 using South Hills Electric as the DBE subcontractor. DBE participation was 12.4%.

Award of the equipment contracts went to **New Holland of Belgrade** for the 4x4 Bi-Directional Tractor, in the amount of \$207,777, and to **MB Companies** for the 4x4 All Wheel Steer Chassis with attachments, in the amount of \$677,796. The equipment acquisition part of this project offered no opportunities for DBEs, so there was no DBE participation by the low bidders.

The total DBE participation for FY 2014 was 12.4%

FY 2015

The AIP projects for FY 2015 was utilized for the completion of two construction projects. The construction projects included: the R/W 9-27 Pavement Maintenance Project and the Airport Security and Access Control Upgrade and Station 1 Standby Generator Project.

The Runway 9-27 Pavement Maintenance Project consisted of: the rehabilitation of Runway 9-27; the rehabilitation of all taxiway connectors; and the re-painting of all taxiway connectors including hold bars, surface painted hold signs, and enhanced center lines as well as the remarking of all paint on R/W 9-27. The low bidder for **Runway 9-27 Pavement Maintenance Project** was **Maxwell Asphalt Inc.**, in the amount of **\$384,100.31**.

The Airport Security and Access Control Upgrade project consisted of the upgrading of the AOA perimeter security fence access gate control system as well as the replacement and/or upgrading of the automatic gates that are part of the perimeter fence. The low bidder for the Airport Security and Access Control System Upgrade was Williamson Fencing, in the amount of \$390,502.00.

The Station 1 Standby Generator Project consisted of the acquisition and installation of a standby generator at the Station 1 facility. The equipment acquisition part of this project offered no opportunities for DBEs, so there was no DBE participation by the low bidders.

Other data used to determine the adjustment to the base figure was the median of historical DBE accomplishments as follows:

Arranging this historical data from low to high, (0%, 0% 12.4%) the median is 4.13%.

The proposed Overall DBE Goals are as follows:

• FY 16-18 (3.79+4.13) = 7.92/3 = 2.64%

To arrive at an overall goal, we added our Step 1 base figure with our Step 2 adjustment figure and then averaged the total arriving at an overall goal of <u>2.64%</u>. We feel this adjusted goal figure will accurately reflect DBE participation that can be achieved for the type of work being awarded during this three-year period.

Considering these factors, a <u>race/gender neutral</u> means of acquiring the overall goal of <u>2.64%</u> has been established.

Helena Regional Airport Authority will attempt to meet the maximum feasible portion of its overall goal by using race-neutral means of facilitating DBE participation. Helena Regional Airport Authority will also use the following race neutral means to increase DBE participation: unbundling large contracts to make them more accessible to small businesses where feasible; ensure the inclusion of DBE's and other small businesses on recipient mailing lists for bidders, and ensuring the dissemination to bidders on prime contracts of lists of potential subcontractors.

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Considering these factors, a <u>race/gender neutral</u> means of acquiring the overall goal of <u>2.64%</u> has been established.

For reporting purposes, race-neutral DBE participation includes, but is not necessarily limited to, the following: DBE participation through a prime contract a DBE obtains through customary competitive procurement procedures; DBE participation through a subcontract on a prime contract that does not carry a DBE goal; DBE participation on a prime contract exceeding a contract goal; and DBE participation through a subcontract from a prime contractor that did not consider a firm's DBE status in making the award.

The Helena Regional Airport Authority has not conducted any disparity studies, and has no other evidence of barriers affecting opportunities for DBEs to form, grow, and compete, however, the Montana Department of Transportation's Civil Rights Bureau conducted a statewide disparity study which was finalized July 2016. The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) has proposed a race-neutral program. The Helena Regional Airport has utilized the findings of the Montana Department of Transportation's Civil Rights Bureau disparity study to determine the existence of discrimination or its effects in the market.

Breakout of Estimated Race Neutral (RN) and Race Conscious (RC) Participation.

26.51(b)(1-9)

The recipient will meet the maximum feasible portion of its overall goal by using RN means of facilitating DBE participation.

- 1. Arranging solicitations, times for the presentation of bids, quantities, specifications, and delivery schedules in ways that facilitates DBE, and other small businesses, participation;

For reporting purposes, RN DBE participation includes, but is not necessarily limited to, the following: DBE participation through a prime contract obtained through customary competitive procurement procedures; DBE participation through a subcontract on a prime contract that does not carry a DBE goal, DBE participation on a prime contract exceeding a contract goal and DBE participation through a subcontract from a prime contractor that did not consider a firm's DBE status in making the award.

Public Participation

Consultation: Section 26.45(g)(1).

The *Helena Regional Airport Authority* submits its overall DBE three-year goal to DOT on August 1 as required by the set schedule.

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Before establishing the overall goal, the *Helena Regional Airport Authority* consulted with the **Montana Department of Transportation, Civil Rights Office** without limiting consultation to these persons or groups, to obtain information concerning the availability of disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged businesses, the effects of discrimination on opportunities for DBEs, and the *Helena Regional Airport Authority*'s efforts to establish a level playing field for the participation of DBEs.

As part of the requirements for Helena Regional Airport Authority to receive FAA Grants for Airport improvements, in accordance with,49 CFR Part 26, Helena Regional Airport Authority was required to conduct a scheduled consultation with minority, women's and general contractor groups, concessionaires, community organizations, and other officials or organizations which could be expected to have information concerning the availability of disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged businesses, the effects of discrimination on opportunities for Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs), and efforts to establish a level playing field for the participation of DBEs. An open meeting was held with as many interested stakeholders as possible focused on obtaining information relevant to the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal setting methodology. The meeting was held on November 22, 2016, at the Helena Regional Airport Offices, Airport Director's Office, 2850 Mercer Loop, Helena, Montana, at 11:00 am local time. Also, a notice regarding the above meeting was placed on the Helena Regional Airport website http://helenaairport.com/ as well as, an e-mail sent to ACDBE concessionaires, and distribution of the advertisement by the State of Montana to their current list of DBEs.

There were ten (10) people who attended the meeting held at the Helena Regional Airport Office, Airport Director's Office on November 22, 2016. There is a copy of the attendance list attached to this goal methodology. There were no comments made by the ten people who attended the meeting.

In addition, the *Helena Regional Airport Authority* published a notice on the *Helena Regional Airport* Website http://helenaairport.com/ for the proposed overall goal, informing the public that the proposed goal and its rationale are available for inspection during normal business hours at the airport administration building for 30 days following the date of the notice, and informing the public that the *Helena Regional Airport Authority* and DOT will accept comments on the goals for 30 days from the date of the notice.

We began using our overall goal on October 1 of the reporting period, unless we receive other instructions from DOT.

Our overall goal submission to DOT included a summary of information and comments received during this public participation process and our responses, if any.

Contract Goals

The *Helena Regional Airport Authority* will use contract goals to meet any portion of the overall goal that the recipient does not project being able to meet using RN means. Contract goals are established so that, over the period to which the overall goal applies, they will cumulatively result in meeting any portion of the recipient's overall goal that is not projected to be met through the use of RN means.

The *Helena Regional Airport Authority* will establish contract goals only on those DOT-assisted contracts that have subcontracting possibilities. It need not establish a contract goal on every such contract, and the size of the contract goals will be adapted to the circumstances of each such contract (e.g., type and location of work and availability of DBE's to perform the particular type of work).

Helena Regional Airport Authority will express our contract goals as a percentage of the Federal share of a DOT-assisted contract.
